ORANGEVILLE ART GROUP WORKSHOP GETTING STARTED WITH A GOOD UNDERPAINTING with SAM PAONESSA

This workshop is designed to help you with one of the fundamental skills: **underpainting**. An underpainting is a first layer of paint applied to a canvas or board and it functions as a base for other layers of paint. It acts as a foundation for your painting and is a great way to start your painting off with some **built in contrast** and **tonal values**. It's a technique that was widely used by the **old masters** as a way to develop a plan for both **composition** and for future color placement and to establish certain **values and tones** within a painting's color palette. Underpainting is the ultimate foundational approach and a well done underpainting gets your painting off to a great start.

Sam Paonessa is a full-time artist and teacher. He is a graduate of the Ontario College of Art and has over thirty years experience as both a commercial and fine artist. Check out Sam's website at: www.sampaonessa.com

Materials:

Bring your usual painting materials (easel, canvas, palette, brushes, paints) with a good selection of colours, at least a yellow, a blue, a red and a white. Canvas panels should be relatively small so that you have time to move the painting well along at the workshop (that would be 12" x 16" largest, consider 9" x 12" or 8" x 10"). For cleaning oil paint from brushes, bring odourless mineral spirits: **NO TURPENTINE**. Please bring a plastic sheet to cover the table as well as a sketchbook and notepad. Please bring a photo reference that you would like to paint.

CrossCurrents Caledon was created by concerned
and caring citizens, in April 2015, to fill a need for
quality entertainment in an intimate environment. Our
goal was to provide an appreciative and attentive
audience for the performer, and a unique and
rewarding experience for the audience.
These events are held every second Friday in the
Bolton United Church. Performers have included
Nigerian-born singer/songwriter Kunle, Ian, Reid,
Canadian folk duo Fraser and Girard, extraordinary
soul singers like Dan Mclean Jr and Deidrey Francois,
Russian group Outro and reknowned singer/story-
teller David Storey. Future events will include
everything from bluegrass to classical recitals to
magic and comedy and even dance and spoken word.
They are compensated via the magic of the tip jar.
We owe much of our success to a lot of hard work
from our volunteers, who donate their time, energy
(and sometimes personal finances) to make these
events happen, and who do everything possible to get
the word out. We also provide real, home-baked
goodies and treats, along with coffee, tea etc.

The back story: Bolton used to have a unique
venue called the Archtop Café, which was a
combined music store and coffee shop. On Sunday
mornings we would gather to meet new people, chat
and listen to world music provided by Stephen Slutsky
on his accordion. A "scene" evolved, with so many
musicians and music people becoming closely
acquainted, and eventually the owner and his wife
began staging regular Friday and sometimes
Saturday evening performances. The
attendance quickly began to grow, and the evenings
often had an almost magical quality about them.
Then, suddenly, it was over - the landlord ejected the
owner and his wife, and the place closed. We were all
shocked and disappointed, so when Steve (Stephen
Slutsky) suggested we all meet and look for a way to
continue what had so quickly become both a tradition
and a phenomenon, we eagerly gathered for a brunch
in the dining room of the Ambassador Hotel, including
town councillor Annette Groves. The concept of
CrossCurrents Caledon was born, and a venue took
shape in the form of an upstairs room at the Bolton
United Church.
