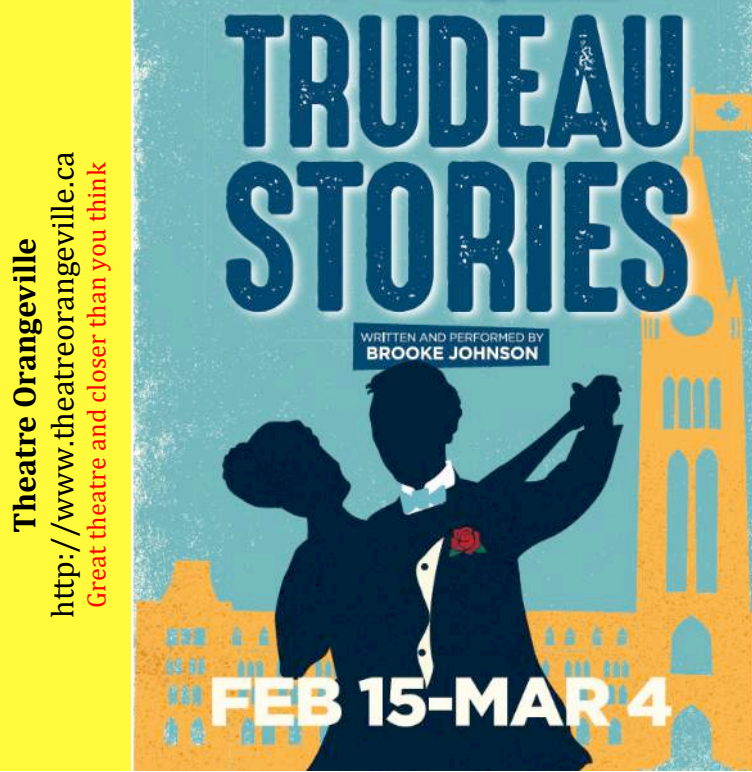

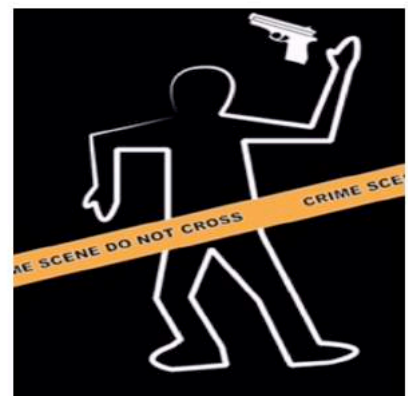

(You never know from where the next idea will come.)

Joan Hope from Dragonfly Arts on Broadway, Orangeville had met with artists at the DAC Artists' Forum, in November 2017. Although she does not price artist's works, she still had important insights into "**Pricing one's art work.**"

I cannot do justice to the whole discussion that day but I will attempt to give out some of the advice shared.

It is up to you, the artist, to:

1. **Know your market**-your audience and locale.;
2. **Compare** -research your work and compare within your market and locale;
3. **Be Consistent in your Pricing**-shows, galleries, or studio. Prices should be the same in the venues. Don't lower the price; stick to it. Art does not go on sale at the Dragonfly. Prices may change over time and experience.
4. **Create your own Formula**-thus creating consistency. Then, stick to it.
 - a. Length x width + ? (? -awards, merit, promotion, time, materials, etc);
 - b. A bell curve -smaller paintings may be a little higher and larger ones a little lower;
 - c. Trial and Error -most likely a comparative formula. Best to have work get pricier as you gain more experience.
 - d. Crafters/Artisans need to be aware of material, time and effort, promotion, etc

Note:

Are you an Artist by vocation, or as a hobbyist? Be careful of websites, as others can take and exploit your images. However, the exposure to a larger audience may be important.

Network with other artists and check (compare) how they promote and sell their works.

Often, sales boil down to what the market can bear.

Get that **first priced** item into the hands of a client.

Regardless-run your art endeavours as a business.
